November 10, 2016 STATE CAPITOL BUILDING, ROOM 317 SANTA FE, NEW MEXICO

1. Call to Order—Chair Abbey called the meeting to order at 8:35 A.M.

- **a. Approval of Agenda**—Chair Abbey asked if there was any objection to the agenda as presented, as there was none the agenda was approved.
- **b.** Correspondence—There were three items under correspondence; Director Gorrell's retirement letter, a letter from a student at Glenwood ES thanking PSFA for the roof repair and a letter from the Central School District thanking PSFA for conducting the Construction Outlook Forum.
- **c. Approval of Minutes (July 25, 2016) -** Mr. Guillen moved for Council approval of the September 26, 2016 minutes, subject to technical corrections. Ms. Kelly seconded. Motion carried.
- 2. Public Comment—Ms. Patricia Matthews, Matthews Fox Law Firm, stated she would be commenting on agenda items 6A and 6B which relate to the legal opinion PSFA received on if the Capital Outlay Council should, within their authority, be looking at whether or not leases comply with 22-8B-4.2 NMSA 1978 and whether Council should be giving an opinion on such, and on agenda item 6C regarding standardized leases, noting the long standing concern of whether or not a standardized lease, when trying to negotiate in the commercial market, actually works. Ms. Matthews proposed additional discussion on the concept of having standardized terms that could be adopted and perhaps a cover sheet that would simplify for PSFA its review of these leases and quickly designate in the lease where the items they need to be reviewing would be found.

3. PSCOC Financial Plan

a. PSCOC Financial Plan

Staff presented the executive summary included in the PSCOC notebooks for this item.

Per Subcommittee request, PSCOC Financial Plan Option 3 was presented. This option reflects, side-by-side, the financial plan as it was depicted in September, the financial plan as it stands for November and the option for solvency. Option 3 was put into place after review by DFA, LFC and LESC and recommendations to address SB4 and SB8, which were enacted during special session for PEDs instructional materials and transportation fund.

Ms. Irion reviewed actual changes incorporated. Included for project reversions from SB8 of \$12.4 million and estimated potential project reversions of \$4.2 million. Also included in the financial plan are Lease Assistance Awards with a potential allocation of \$15.6 million for FY17. After review of the financial plan, there is a change to the Broadband Deficiencies Correction Program Awards for FY17; last month's financial plan reflected a need of \$6.8 million, it has been determined this additional expenditure is not required for FY17; however, in out-years FY18-19 under Option 3 \$8 million has been included for FY18 and \$7 million has been included for FY19. Also under the financial plan option is HB219; in the previous financial plan there was \$5 million allocated in FY18-19 for New Mexico Pre-K which has now been removed. The current PSFA operating budget was approved at \$6,039,700; Option 3 includes a reduction to \$5.8 million in FY17 and additional reductions in out-years. Emergency Reserve for Contingency has been reduced to \$1 million for each year in FY17-21. Following discussion during the recent Awards Subcommittee meeting Alamogordo Combined construction funding is being kept in 2018 Q1, there is no delay for the project, however the plan incorporates a \$1.5 million demolition to be moved into 2019 Q3. Another change made to bring the financial plan solvent under Option 3 is to move Clovis Highland ES construction funding. The district is amenable to this change and the project was moved from 2018 Q1 to 2018 Q3. Systems initiative and standards-based awards in FY17-21 are reduced based upon potential funding availability.

Following discussion on HB219, Mr. Abbey suggested it be listed in the last year it is authorized for expenditure. Ms. Gudgel pointed out that Option 3 reflects \$8 million for Broadband which is higher than the scenario presented in Subcommittee; Mr. Abbey asked about the different amounts and Ms. Gudgel replied the material presented at Subcommittee included scenarios with a zero dollar amount versus \$6 million and staff had been asked to come up with a third option in order for Alamogordo to be funded on time. Ms. Clarke stated there was discussion during the AMS Subcommittee on how SB4 funding should be reflected on the financial plan and felt it should not be included in either sources or uses since the awards will not go through the PSCOC.

MOTION: Ms. Clarke moved for Council adoption of financial plan Option 3 for solvency. Mr. Aguilar seconded. Motion carried.

b. Certification of SSTBs

Discussion: The certification is for the upcoming sale in December. The anticipated capacity is \$9,663,000 with a certification need estimated at \$25,082,799. Projects within the certification include: Bernalillo Santo Domingo ES for \$1.5 million; Gallup Lincoln ES for \$4.7 million; Capitan ES/HS for \$1 million; Belen Rio Grande ES for \$9.4 million; NMSBVI Quimby Gymnasium for \$1.7 million; NMSBVI Sacramento Dormitory for \$2.1 million and Systems Initiative for \$3.9 million. Additional lease assistance is also included at \$1 million. Per Ms. Clarke, the exact amount of the supplemental tax note will be known in late December.

MOTION: Council approval of the Awards Subcommittee recommendation to adopt the Certification and Resolution to sell SSTBs subject to review by Deputy Secretary Clarke and Chair Abbey verifying the amounts. Since this is a Subcommittee recommendation a second is not required. Motion carried.

c. Recertification of SSTBs

Discussion: Ms. Irion reviewed the Recertification Reconciliation Worksheet, noting the original certification for long term debt is \$81,011,691. Items pending budgets in SHARE are Mountainair Jr. / Sr. HS for \$8,644,126 and Gallup Lincoln ES for \$9,270,979. The original arbitrage certificate did not include these two projects and the recertification is requested so dollars can be expended.

Mr. Peralta noted the descriptions for Las Cruces HS and Socorro San Antonio ES under Exhibit A are identical and asked Ms. Irion to verify the information and correct.

MOTION: Mr. Guillen moved for Council approval of the staff recommendation to adopt the Resolution, Notification and Certification amendment for reauthorization of unexpended bond proceeds as follows: 2015B in the amount of \$17,915,105 to PSCOC award projects totaling \$17,915,105. Ms. Gudgel seconded. Motion carried.

d. Update on Project Closeouts for Potential Reversion (informational)

Discussion: Staff has updated the project closeout spreadsheet with a column indicating final reversions. Of the 209 projects slated for closeout, 58 have been completed. Staff is behind schedule and anticipates completion and a final reversion amount reported to Council in December. Mr. Aguilar expressed displeasure suggesting caution be used when determining deadlines as it doesn't make PSFA look good and gives Council false expectations if they are not met. Ms. Kelly asked Ms. Cano if the \$1.3 million for Atrisco Heritage was pulled out of contingency; Ms. Cano stated the amount reflected is due to the district to complete the closeout and will come from the \$5 million set aside in the financial plan for project closeouts. Ms. Kelly reminded staff during AMS she had requested the amounts spent on emergencies versus contingencies be listed. Ms. Cano clarified the \$1.3 million was neither a project cost overrun or an emergency and was actually a cost within the original project budget allocated for award. Mr. Abbey asked how staff ensures districts are not providing improper receipts; Ms. Cano replied that proof of payment and the associated contractual documents are required.

Ms. Gudgel stated it might be thoughtful to include language in awards that once projects are finished districts have a certain period of time to complete the work for closeout. Ms. Cano stated there is currently a stipulation within the MOU indicating no later than 18 months after substantial completion of construction the financial closeout will be complete. Agreeing 18 months is a long timeframe, Mr. Guillen stated the Awards Subcommittee would be happy to take a look at this and offer ideas to consider on reducing the time for financial closeout. Mr. Abbey requested staff write a guideline and bring to Council in January.

4. Out-of-Cycle Funding/Additional Funding/Emergency Funding/Award Language Requests

a. Espanola – P12-006 – Velarde ES – Phase 2 Request to Proceed

Staff presented the executive summary included in the PSCOC notebooks for this item.

Discussion: The district is seeking Council approval to proceed with the project. The original award, made in July 2011, was for 145 students, grades K-6 with certain adequacy standards variance; project cost to adequacy was \$4,545,645. There was a Phase 1 state match offset and

a Phase 1 district match of \$454,565. The award also included a modification of the previous FY05-06 Alcalde ES award to reduce core capacity to 200 students, grades K-6.

An assessment was recently conducted to determine if the deficient conditions still existed; it was determined conditions had improved slightly per some improvements. Based upon a letter received from parents and students, Mr. Guillen felt staff should reassess the project to ensure the assessment was accurate.

Mr. Eric Martinez, Superintendent, Espanola Public Schools and Mr. Adan Cordova, Facilities Manager, commented that the district is ready to move forward with construction and felt the assessment was done in haste. Referring to the Velarde ES handout, Mr. Martinez stated the original building was built in 1932, with additions made in 1982 and 1992. Though there have been upgrades to the HVAC and roof, both systems are near or at 100% expired. There are concerns with lead based paint and adobe structural issues; in addition, the building is not to adequacy. Mr. Abbey inquired about Alcalde's capacity as it is brand new and located four miles away; Mr. Martinez replied it has capacity of 200 and is currently at 227 students. Upon asking for audience comment, Ms. Leslie Marsh and Ms. Antonia Valdez, Velarde ES employees agreed the renovation was needed adding there were numerous concerns with HVAC, rotting door frames, water fountain issues and swaying exterior walls. Mr. Abbey proposed the Awards Subcommittee revisit this item after additional information is provided.

MOTION: Council approval of the Awards Subcommittee recommendation to rescind the unexpended balance of the 2011-2012 award to the Espanola Public Schools for Velarde Elementary School. Any unused portion of the direct appropriation offset of Phase 1 planning and design will apply to a future award.

AMENDED MOTION: Mr. Guillen moved to table this item until further information and detail is provided. Ms. Gudgel seconded. Motion carried.

b. Espanola – P16-002 – Abiquiu ES – Award Language Change and Phase 1 Design Funding

Staff presented the executive summary included in the PSCOC notebooks for this item.

Discussion: The award currently states up to 150 students, the motion reduces the design capacity up to 130 students based on recent enrollment utilization. Additionally the building systems analysis report indicates there is the possibility of a reduction in square footage. The facility currently has nine classroom and for 130 students, only seven classrooms are needed. If classrooms were at capacity the facility could hold 158 students which allows for possible future growth. Mr. Martinez acknowledged the enrollment trends were accurate. Mr. McMurray proposed in order to right size the school that two classrooms be considered above adequacy which the district would then be responsible for the costs to renovate. Mr. Tillotson stated the FMAR was 51% which reflects poor maintenance. Discussions have taken place with the maintenance supervisor; they are progressing with their maintenance plan and are responding to recent FMAR findings in an effort to improve their scores.

MOTION: Council approval of the Awards Subcommittee recommendation to amend the 2015-2016 standards-based award to Espanola Public Schools for Abiquiu ES to include Phase 1 planning and design to adequacy for up to 130 students, grades K-6, with an increase in the state share amount of \$135,059 (63%), and a corresponding increase in the local share amount of \$79,321 (37%). Since this is a Subcommittee recommendation a second is not required. Motion carried.

c. Ruidoso – P15-013 – Nob Hill ES – Phase 2 Request to Proceed

Staff presented the executive summary included in the PSCOC notebooks for this item.

Discussion: The district is offering to use their money to proceed and when Council has funding available the district would be reimbursed the state share they advanced. Ms. Clarke expressed concern as Council is being asked to commit future funds. Ruidoso School Board President Mr. Greg Cory acknowledged the state's financial challenges, noting the state portion is 10% or less. A bond was passed earlier this year to get the project started; the project and scope was designed to save money; classrooms are being consolidated with an existing campus, overhead is being reduced and food services is also being consolidated. Demolition has been slated to commence in December. The district has retained adequate cash reserves and is requesting the project be started as quickly as possible. Ms. Gudgel was concerned about the 2017 Q3 repayment requirement and asked about possible difficulties if Council could not meet that deadline. Superintendent Dr. George Bickert replied the district was comfortable if the state match was delayed to 2017 Q4 or 2018 Q1 as they are not guaranteed to need the money in 2017 Q3. Ms. Gudgel also asked if there were any arbitrage issues with the bonds; Mr. Bickert replied there were none. Ms. Clarke clarified tax exempt proceeds could not be used to pay past expenditures and taxable sponge note proceeds would have to be used.

MOTION: Council approval of the Awards Subcommittee recommendation to amend the 2014-2015 standards-based award to Ruidoso Municipal Schools for Nob Hill Elementary to include construction to adequacy for 192, grades Pre-K/K. Based upon current estimates, the district may proceed with construction at 100% district funding at this time with an increase in the total project cost of \$10,177,229. An increase in the state share amount of \$1,111,088 may be released for expenditure in the third quarter of calendar year 2017 pending funding availability and final approval by the PSCOC; at which time the district funding for the project will be reduced by the state share amount. Since this is a Subcommittee recommendation a second is not required. Motion carried.

d. Silver – P14-024 – Aldo Leopold Charter School – Rescind Award

Staff presented the executive summary included in the PSCOC notebooks for this item.

Discussion: With new leadership at both the charter school and district, Mr. Wayne Sherwood, Executive Director at Aldo Leopold, is hopeful they may be able to identify space at either Western New Mexico University or within the Silver School District. The charter has requested existing funding totaling \$50,000 be left in place for a feasibility study to assist them in exploring their options.

MOTION: Council approval of the Awards Subcommittee recommendation to rescind the 2013-2014 standards-based award to Aldo Leopold Charter School. The previously-funded early planning award will remain available for the feasibility study in order to consider new options for the school. Any funding not expended within 18 months will revert to the Public School Capital Outlay Fund. Since this is a Subcommittee recommendation a second is not required. Motion carried.

e. Broadband Deficiencies Correction Program Awards

Staff presented the executive summary included in the PSCOC notebooks for this item.

Discussion: Motion 1 relates to fiber and Category 2 equipment projects recently approved by the E-rate program; Motion 2 relates to a renewal of the E-rate support agreement.

Per Mr. Viorica, the Category 1 fiber project connecting Columbus ES to Deming Central Office is lower than estimated. The project will increase the connection speed available to Columbus ES and reduces the price per megabit. Drawing attention to the list of Category 2 projects, Mr. Viorica indicated Albuquerque, approved at the last Council meeting, had an adjustment to the state match amounting to an increase of \$1,969. Ms. Kelly stated PSFA had estimated \$33 million for fiber project costs; now that USAC has issued their funding commitment letters it appears the costs are significantly less. Mr. Viorica replied the total was approximately \$18 million; according to Ms. Kelly USAC approximates \$23.6 million based on the 471s and suggested they compare notes to ensure they are on the same page. Governor Martinez did send a letter to the CEO of USAC encouraging the expediency of issuing the awards for the districts that had applied for 471. Mr. Abbey inquired how the lower costs affected the financial plan; Mr. Viorica stated it was unknown as the projects are in the development stage; though there is a "not to exceed" amount in place projects listed in the financial plan would be revisited in March 2018 after proposals are received from vendors.

Regarding Motion 2, Mr. Viorica stated this was an agreement procured under an RFP for an E-rate consultant to assist the BDCP Education Initiative for schools that need assistance with the complex E-rate program. The total agreement amount is \$212,089.69 annually. Though the Broadband program is extremely valuable, Ms. Gudgel felt Council needs to be cautious about expectations in terms of future commitments; Mr. Abbey agreed. Upon asking for audience comment on the E-rate program; Ms. Ragena Blankenship, Director of Technology at Deming Public Schools, Mr. Jason Johnson, Executive Director of IT at Albuquerque Public Schools, Ms. Karen Bolander, Executive Director of IT at Rio Rancho Public Schools and Mr. Rusty Rucker, Technology Coordinator at Regional Educational Cooperative #6 all expressed gratitude to have had the E-rate assistance available and added that the program was a great opportunity in meeting future expectations.

Mr. Abbey requested Awards Subcommittee work with staff to revisit the funding formula to ensure we are being equitable in dealing with all needs; keeping in mind the needs of the district, conditions being dealt with and the financial struggles the state faces.

MOTION 1: Make Broadband Deficiencies Correction Program (BDCP) awards of actual E-rate approved project amounts to provide the state match for application funding year 2016 to

the districts set out in the Revised State Match columns of the award spreadsheets on pages 2 and 3 of this agenda item for the purposes and up to the amounts specified (see attached). Each allocation is intended to fully complete the project, phase or specified purpose. Since this is a Subcommittee recommendation a second is not required. Motion carried.

and

MOTION 2: Make Broadband Deficiencies Correction Program (BDCP) award Not to Exceed \$220,000 to renew the statewide agreement to provide E-rate assistance to all the public schools, to the Broadband Deficiencies Correction Program and to the State E-rate coordinator in order to maximize the amount of federal funding New Mexico public schools receive from the program. Since this is a Subcommittee recommendation a second is not required. Motion carried.

5. 2016-2017 Standards-Based Capital Outlay Awards Cycle

a. 2016-2017 Lease Assistance Awards

Staff presented the executive summary included in the PSCOC notebooks for this item.

Discussion: Staff looked at 25 charter schools where 50% awards were made; a number of those schools have since come in to compliance by submitting affidavits or lease amendments to ensure the owner maintains adequacy. The motion requests the adjustment of the awards to 100% for the schools that are in compliance. Of the 25 charter schools, 15 have become compliant; the award for the additional 50% would be \$1,187,775. Ten charters remain noncompliant, however staff continues to receive documentation and will bring additional recommendations in December. The 15 schools requesting approval for award include: The GREAT Academy, New Mexico International School, Nuestros Valores Charter School, Academy of Trades and Technology HS, Six Directions Indigenous School, Corrales International School, The Montessori ES, ACE Leadership HS, Sandoval Academy of Bilingual Education, Mosaic Academy, La Promesa Early Leaning Center Charter School, South Valley Preparatory School, Monte del Sol Charter, The ASK Academy and Technology Leadership HS.

Ms. Matthews thanked Ms. Gudgel, Mr. Guillen and the Awards Subcommittee for working with the charter schools

MOTION: Council approval of the Awards Subcommittee recommendation to make awards for charter schools previously awarded at 50 percent identified in the attached spreadsheet as compliant with Section 22-8B-4.2 NMSA 1978 and PSCOC documentation requirements at 100 percent of the maximum allowable lease assistance amount. Upon acceptance of awards by charter schools and school districts, the Council authorizes PSFA staff to distribute award amounts quarterly on a reimbursement basis upon receiving proof of lease payments made. The Council authorizes PSFA staff to make reductions to award amounts subject to PED certifying in writing to PSFA that a condition exists that warrants an award adjustment or suspension which may include: school closure, charter revocation, financial violation or irregularities, adjustment to certified attendance numbers (MEM counts), lease termination or amendment. The Council may also authorize reductions if the scheduled attendance does not fully utilize facility, or operational use changes from classroom to non-classroom uses. Since this is a Subcommittee recommendation a second is not required. Motion carried.

b. 2016-2017 Master Plan Assistance Program Awards

Staff presented the executive summary included in the PSCOC notebooks for this item.

Discussion: Of the 20 applications received; 17 were from school districts and 3 were from state-chartered charter schools. The total amount requested, without waivers, is \$451,332.49; there is an estimated budget of \$500,000. Staff recommends no award for two applicants: Espanola as their FMP is valid until 2019 and SAMS as they have not yet been renewed and are not eligible for an award. Staff did not have time to validate the statements of financial position submitted for the 4 waiver requests and determined since awards are due in March a full examination could take place in April on any of the requests.

MOTION: Council approval of the Awards Subcommittee recommendation to make the 2016-2017 Facilities Master Plan awards as listed to the districts/state charters up to the estimated amounts specified in the spreadsheet on page 1 of this agenda item. These amounts represent the state share portion of the estimated cost to develop a facility master plan at each of these districts/state charters to the PSFA guidelines and require a corresponding district match as set forth in the current state/local match formula. The four requests for waivers are postponed; based upon execution of contracts for awards and budget availability, waivers for those districts will be considered at the April 2017 PSCOC meeting. Since this is a Subcommittee recommendation a second is not required. Motion carried.

c. Systems Initiative

Staff presented the executive summary included in the PSCOC notebooks for this item.

Discussion: Ms. Diaz reviewed the summary of changes made to the pre-application and scoring criteria. Members expressed concern over the possible 60 point allocation as schools that do not require a reduction of square footage would receive zero points thus changing the maximum allowable they could receive to 50. Extensive discussion ensued on how to adjust the point imbalance. Mr. Abbey clarified the need for schools to be ranked appropriately against each other and proposed schools either get the 60 points as outlined or they get 50 points prorated to 60 by taking their score and multiplying by 1.2.

Mr. Abbey asked how much money was available for the systems initiative this year; Ms. Irion replied with the adoption of Option 3 there is \$10.7 million available. Mr. Abbey asked if there was a sunset on the no waivers and no advances criteria. Per Ms. Cano, the only requirement was that funds be expended within three years of the allocation; Ms. Gudgel added that SB4 removed all limitations for the program. Mr. Abbey proposed there be a one year sunset on no waivers or advances; Mr. Guillen counter proposed a three year sunset on the current application and ranking, and members agreed. Council also agreed to use the prorated version for the 10 points for districts that don't need to reduce space. Staff to bring back to AMS.

MOTION: Council approval of the AMS Subcommittee recommendation to approve the 2016 draft systems scoring criteria (page 5) and pre-application (pages 6-18) for ranking Systems Initiative projects, and pending the funding availability, proceed with releasing the pre-application to districts.

AMENDED MOTION: Ms. Kelly moved for Council approval of the AMS Subcommittee recommendation to approve the 2016 draft systems scoring criteria (page 5) and preapplication (pages 6-18) for ranking Systems Initiative projects, and pending funding availability, proceed with releasing the pre-application to districts inclusive of a three year sunset on the Systems Initiative rules and inclusive of a 50 point pro-rated scoring criteria. Ms. Clarke seconded. Motion carried.

d. 2016-2017 Work Plan/Timeline (informational)

Staff presented the executive summary included in the PSCOC notebooks for this item.

Discussion: Ms. Cano noted potential conflicts for the December 16th PSCOC meeting. Following discussion, Council agreed to move the meeting to December 21st at 8:30 a.m.

6. Other Business

a. PSCOC Role in Compliance with 22-8B-4.2 NMSA 1978

Staff presented the executive summary included in the PSCOC notebooks for this item.

Discussion: As noted in the executive summary, it is the opinion of staff that Authority has a limited scope of responsibility with respect to leases and lease purchase agreements and it is the charter authorizers who have authority and responsibility for all other assurances of charter school statutory compliance. Ms. Gudgel stated a meeting has been scheduled to further discuss if PSFA and PSCOC are the appropriate groups to do this and felt it was premature to share with the Task Force until further discussion took place. Mr. Aguilar stated the memo was an attorney's opinion of the duties of the PSFA; adding that statutory responsibility for PSFA is to support the PSCOC, not to determine on their own what they should or should not be doing and agreed this should not be shared with Task Force at this time. Ms. Clarke felt a full legal review should take place and commented if the Council and PSFA hired an attorney to advise on certain matters it needs to be understood attorney-client privilege exists and should never be waived without Council approval.

MOTION: Council approval of the AMS Subcommittee recommendation to the PSCOOTF to review the PSCOC Role in Compliance with 22-8B-4.2 NMSA 1978 for implementation.

AMENDED MOTION: Ms. Gudgel moved to table the motion until further discussion took place. Ms. Clark seconded. Motion carried.

b. Charter Renewals (informational)

Staff presented the executive summary included in the PSCOC notebooks for this item.

Discussion: There are 24 charters pending renewal by PEC. Of the 24, 14 have met requirements under statute. Ms. Matthews commented of the 10 that had not met requirements, there were mistakes regarding the information upon which the determination was made and there is a difference of opinion as to whether or not leases do contain legally sufficient language. Ms. Matthews reiterated when opinions are rendered as to whether an existing lease is sufficiently compliant with statute problems will continue to arise.

c. Standardized Leases

Staff presented the executive summary included in the PSCOC notebooks for this item.

Discussion: Mr. Aguilar, Ms. Matthews, Ms. Fox, and PED general counsel have recently met to discuss lease purchase agreements. There are issues with the pledge and covenant components and work continues on what is considered a substantially approvable template with specifics for different circumstances.

MOTION: Council approval of the AMS Subcommittee recommendation to the PSCOOTF to review for implementation a requirement that all charter schools that receive lease assistance, use the PSCOC approved Standardized leases for Lease Agreements and Lease Purchase Agreements.

AMENDED MOTION: Ms. Kelly moved to table this discussion until the December PSCOC. Mr. Aguilar seconded. Motion carried.

d. FY16 Annual Report

Staff presented the executive summary included in the PSCOC notebooks for this item.

Discussion: Ms. Gudgel asked if the annual report went through formal edits; Ms. McEuen stated staff has edited it multiple times and authors have reviewed their articles however it has not gone through a professional editor.

MOTION: Council approval of the AMS Subcommittee recommendation to delegate final approval, authorization to print and distribute the FY2016 Annual Report to LCS Director Burciaga. Since this is a Subcommittee recommendation a second is not required. Motion carried.

e. Maintenance Cost Codes

Staff presented the executive summary included in the PSCOC notebooks for this item.

Discussion: During the AMS Subcommittee, items were reviewed regarding maintenance cost codes with some reviewed by PED regarding the potential implementation within the current system. Ms. Irion stated there are some cost constraints with regard to the OBMS System as this would require some reporting functions be changed within the reporting mechanism. Ms. Kelly stated this was intended to be an informational item and not an action item.

MOTION: Council approval of the AMS Subcommittee recommendation to the PSCOOTF to review the maintenance cost codes for implementation.

AMENDED MOTION: Ms. Kelly moved to table this discussion. Mr. Aguilar seconded. Motion carried.

f. Ben Lujan Maintenance Achievement Awards (informational)

Staff presented the executive summary included in the PSCOC notebooks for this item.

Discussion: PSFA recognized 11 districts for their performance in maintenance and operations. Superintendents and board members also had the opportunity to award their individual staff for maintenance and custodial services. Mr. Tillotson thanked Mr. Burciaga for being the keynote speaker during the awards luncheon.

g. PSCOC Subcommittee Meetings

Staff presented the executive summary included in the PSCOC notebooks for this item.

Discussion: The issue is whether or not subcommittees should be open meetings. Ms. Clarke's understanding is if a subcommittee is delegated authority to take final action the meeting should be open however, if the subcommittee is making a recommendation to Council then it does not have to be open. Ms. Gudgel added if there are discussions that directly impact certain people and they ask to attend they should be allowed to do so. Mr. Abbey suggested that the determination of an open or closed subcommittee meeting would be a discretion of the Chair of each subcommittee.

h. Succession Plan for PSFA Director

Staff presented the executive summary included in the PSCOC notebooks for this item.

Discussion: Ms. Sawyer is working on a job description, and advertisements will be placed in January with various outlets and a selection committee will review applications to determine the top three for interviews. Mr. Guillen stated it would be helpful if the timeline indicated which items were to fall under executive session and recommended the full Council be involved in the process of identifying a new executive director. Discussion ensued on the timeline and Council's involvement; Mr. Abbey proposed the AMS Subcommittee members be the selection committee and Council's involvement should include reviewing the list of all applicants at some point. AMS will make a recommendation on the top three candidates to interview. Another matter to consider is a possible terminal leave payout; Mr. Abbey suggested this be dealt with in budget projection.

7. Informational

a. Broadband Deficiencies Correction Program Status Report

Staff presented the executive summary included in the PSCOC notebooks for this item.

b. PSCOC Project Status Report

Staff presented the executive summary included in the PSCOC notebooks for this item.

Mr. Abbey asked about Albuquerque Arroyo del Oso ES, Ms. Viscarra stated the district is working to decide on how to move forward. A feasibility study has been done and staff anticipates they will request an awards language change in January.

c. Master Plan Project Status Report

Staff presented the executive summary included in the PSCOC notebooks for this item.

d. Lease Assistance Status Report

Staff presented the executive summary included in the PSCOC notebooks for this item.

Based upon Council action, there are now 93 compliant schools for a total of \$15,099,589.

e. Maintenance Program Status Report

Staff presented the executive summary included in the PSCOC notebooks for this item.

f. FY17 PSFA Budget Projection and Personnel Update

Staff presented the executive summary included in the PSCOC notebooks for this item.

Per Ms. Sawyer, the agency looks to revert approximately \$321,000 for FY17 with \$319,000 coming from personnel services and employee benefits.

Ms. Gudgel stated in the adopted financial plan the budget was changed from \$6 million to \$5.8 million and, referring to the pending positions listed in the executive summary, asked if the \$321,000 anticipates those positions being filled; Ms. Irion stated it does not. Mr. Abbey clarified by adopting the financial plan at \$5.8 million; it was a guidance for lower spending, not necessarily a directive to submit a revised budget. Mr. Aguilar disagreed as every agency has been asked to take a cut. Ms. Clarke agreed there was no formal action to reduce the budget but did feel it was warranted and reminded members the financial plan calls for a one-step phased-down budget over remaining years. Ms. Irion reminded members of the need to incorporate any overlap for the departure of the executive director.

8. Executive Session

Sources

SSTB (Revenue Budgeted July) & SSTB (Revenue Budgeted January). SSTB (Supplemental Severance Tax Bond) are issued and sold by the New Mexico State Board of Finance upon receiving a Resolution signed by the Chair of the PSCOC certifying the need to sell bonds pursuant to the Public School Capital Outlay Act (the "Act"). Amounts are budgeted by the Public School Facilities Authority (PSFA) into the Public School Capital Outlay Fund (the "Fund"). Amounts reported for prior fiscal years are actuals. Amounts in the current fiscal year and out-years are the most current/available capacity estimates prepared bi-annually by the Board of Finance.

Project & Operating Reversions / Advance Repayments. Project reversions are proceeds budgeted in the Fund from prior SSTB sales for PSCOC project phase awards that have been identified by PSFA staff as available for new project awards or other uses permitted pursuant to the Act. Amounts are determined based on unexpended award balances from projects that are financially closed-out through a post project financial audit performed by the PSFA on an ongoing basis. Operating reversions are unexpended amounts from PSFA's annual operating budget. Advance repayments are amounts remitted back to the PSFA and deposited into the Fund from school districts for advances of funds for districts share amounts on PSCOC projects. Amounts reported for prior fiscal years are actuals. Other amounts are estimates prepared and updated by PSFA on a quarterly basis.

Uses

Capital Improvements Act (SB-9), Lease Payment Assistance Awards, Master Plan Assistance Awards, PSFA Operating Budget, CID Inspections & Project Encumbrance Needs are uses subject to funding availability and permitted pursuant to the Public School Capital Outlay Act and Capital Improvements Act unless otherwise indicated.

Capital Improvements Act (SB-9) are amounts are for distributions to school districts through the Public Education Department (PED). Transfer amounts from the PSCO Fund are calculated anually and administered by and budgeted to the PED.

CID Inspections are amounts that may be approved annually by the PSCOC for transfer from the PSCO Fund to the Regulation and Licensing Department for expedited inspection services by the Construction Industries Division at PSCOC project sites.

PSFA Operating Budget are amounts that may be approved annually by the Legislature for transfer from the PSCO Fund to the PSFA Operating Fund for administration and oversight of PSCOC projects and carrying out duties pursuant to the Public School Capital Outlay Act.

Lease Payment Assistance Awards are amounts that may be approved annually for reimbursing school districts and charter schools for leasing K-12 facilities.

Master Plan Assistance Awards are amounts that may be approved annually for the state share of the cost of updating a school district or charter schools five year facility master plans.

Project Closeouts are projected amounts that may be reimbursed to the districts upon the completion of financial audits for previously awarded projects. In order to align the total project expenditures to adequacy with the MOU match percentages, amounts may be due to the district if the State share of the expenditures is less than the MOU State match percentage. During the transition from FIFO (pooled funds) to project-specific budgets, projects which had reached construction completion may not have been assigned a budget, and this line item will be used to make those reimbursements. PSFA anticipates the need for this line item allocation in FY15 and FY16 for a combined total of \$12million, but does not anticipate additional need in the out years.

Project Encumbrance Needs are amounts that may be approved annually for entering into contracts for the state share to adequacy for PSCOC awarded projects. Encumbrance needs are phase award estimates prepared and updated by PSFA on a quarterly basis.

Project Awards Schedule

Amounts in the Schedule are the total state share phase award amounts grouped by award year and phase (Design & Construction). Design phases are indicated with the color blue; construction phase(s) are indicated with the color green. Uncertified phases are indicated in italics. Partially certified phases are indicated with italics and an asterisk (*). Funding needs are estimated by phase and across fiscal years based on project schedules. Phase award amounts and schedules are estimates prepared and updated by PSFA on a quarterly basis.

The total amount of 2016-2017 lease assistance awards is \$15,602,577.00. Upon acceptance of awards by charter schools and school districts, the Council authorizes PSFA staff to distribute award amounts quarterly on a reimbursement basis upon receiving proof of lease payments made. The Council authorizes PSFA staff to make reductions to award amounts subject to PED certifying in writing to PSFA that a condition exists that warrants an award adjustment or suspension which may include: school closure, charter revocation, financial violation or irregularities, adjustment to certified attendance numbers (MEM counts), lease termination or amendment. The Council may also authorize reductions if scheduled attendance does not fully utilize facility, or operational use changes from classroom to non-classroom uses.

From the Draft Ranking to the Preliminary Ranking eleven schools moved into the top 100 and eleven moved out. Most of the ones that moved into the top 100 are due to moving up into vacated spaces. Ten moved out of the top 100 due to a site assessment, and one due to a Facility Master Plan update.

IV. Potential Motion:

Rescind the unexpended balance of the 2011-2012 award to the Española Public Schools for Velarde Elementary School. Any unused portion of the direct appropriation offset of phase 1 planning and design will apply to a future award. The district is encouraged to apply for a systems-based award.

V. Executive Summary:

Staff recommendation is to rescind the award and encourage the district to reapply for a project in the future if they qualify.

When the project was awarded, the wNMCI was 55.94%. Once a project is awarded, their rank remains the same until the scope of the award is complete. However, based upon a recent re-assessment at the request of the district, it appears that the current wNMCI for Velarde ES is 35.63%. This is due a combination of educational space issues that have been resolved as enrollment has declined and some deficiencies have been corrected since the time of the award, either by replacement or by extended life based upon the condition.

This project was awarded in 2011. The design was completed and the project went out to bid, however, after bids were received the School Board voted not to proceed with construction. In May, 2013, the district reported that the School Board was considering consolidation and was not prepared to proceed with the project. The Council voted to table the motion for out-of-cycle construction funding until the district had come to a decision.

VI. Award History:

Original Award: July 29, 2011

Project Cost Estimate to Adequacy: \$4,545,645 Phase 1 Award: \$454,565 Phase 1 State Match: \$0 (Offset) Phase 1 District Match: \$454,565

Award Language: Planning and design to renovate and make additions to existing facilities to adequacy for 145 students, grades K-6 with certain adequacy standards to be variance at district's request. Award also includes a modification of the previous 05-06 Alcalde ES award to reduce core capacity to 200 serving grades K-6. District may, at its own expense, fund increased construction of the core of Alcalde ES to the original award capacity of 400. District shall demonstrate ability to maintain facilities and create a plan to pass SB-9 Election.

May 1, 2013: Espanola School Board voted not to proceed with construction of Velarde.

May 3, 2013: Request for Out-of-Cycle Construction

Mr. Art Blea, Superintendent, represented the district. He reported that their School Board rejected the recommendation for the construction firm to proceed with the project; therefore the district is not prepared to move forward with the project. There is a possibility that the School Board will revisit the possibility of consolidation of the Velarde and Alcalde elementary schools.


Council tabled the motion until the local school board unites with the Alcalde/Velarde communities for the possibility of consolidation of the two schools or decision to proceed with the Velarde project.

RE: Results of November 22, 2016 Velarde Elementary School wNMCI assessment related to Maintenance

A facility walkthrough conducted on November 22, 2016 of the Espanola Districts, Velarde Elementary School campus identified the following maintenance conditions:

- Facility Maintenance Assessment Report (FMAR) The walkthrough identified & supported the findings in the recent school site FMAR conducted on February 10, 2016, indicating maintenance conditions were Poor with a rating of 51.14%. The previous FMAR conducted in May of 2012 indicated maintenance effectiveness was Marginal with a rating of 65.42%. Conditions from 2012 to 2016 indicate maintenance effectiveness has declined.
- There are opportunities for maintenance improvement in many areas. Several of the HVAC systems were identified as inoperable. Specifically, a swamp cooler pulley was observed missing, ductwork was torn, classroom heating air filters were observed aged, dirty and in poor condition with needed repairs. Several units on the roof were also reported as not working. Drafty unsealed windows were observed. Exterior doors were identified as needing adjustment and 1 needs to be replaced. Several ceiling tiles need replaced/repaired. One small active leak was observed. We were unable to determine exact cause. One roof drain was found severely clogged. Kitchen faucets were observed broken & leaking bathroom sink drains were also noted.

• Capital Needs:

o **Roof**: The facility roof is in very poor condition and in need of replacement. The rolled bitumen surface over the gymnasium and newer section of the building is observed

intact with the granules deteriorated. The material build-up and clogged drains are indicators of a need for improved maintenance. The older section of the building complex is also rolled bitumen observed very rippled, with severely impaired drainage, surface granule deterioration with many large holes and weak areas to include a large section of roof parapet section no longer adhered to the surface.

- O HVAC: HVAC was noted as a combination of window swamp coolers that the district reported as not all working. 1 of 4 large units on the gym roof observed missing 1 cover panel and the pulley inside also missing. Other areas of concern are holes in the rubber ductwork connections that routine maintenance would identify. Improperly sealed windows (HVAC window ductwork) were identified in many areas where cold air was coming in from the outside.
- o **Exterior Stucco**: A large stucco area just outside the library was identified as separating from the foam core. It would appear as though the adhesive failed and needs repair. Many holes were observed to include utility holes that should be sealed to prevent moisture damage, again routine maintenance to protect the building envelope.
- o **Exterior Windows**: Exterior wood window assemblies are in poor condition with severe deterioration and exterior air flow and penetration.

Overall: The facility walkthrough identified routine maintenance efforts need to improve (verified by the FMAR) in addition to potential capital improvement needs in roofing, HVAC, exterior windows and stucco repair. The district recently assigned a site based maintenance technician to the school. We are working with the districts maintenance staff assisting with the FMAR through FIMS to improve the overall condition of the facility and maintenance effectiveness.

RE: Results of November 22, 2016 Velarde Elementary School wNMCI assessment

Velarde Elementary school received a PSCOC award for renovation and remodel in 2011-2012. In 2013 the Espanola School Board elected to cancel the construction contract in order to consider the possibility of consolidating Velarde and Alcalde Elementary Schools once the school board had the opportunity to meet with the communities. The project was subsequently on hold until the school board voted to move the Velarde construction project forward in September of 2016.

The following assessments were performed at Velarde Elementary:

March 3, 2008; PSFA scheduled assessment

• wNMCI score 55.94%

February 2, 2016; assessment performed due to no movement on construction

• wNMCI score 34.02%

October 12, 2016; assessment performed due to no movement on construction

• wNMCI score 34.02%

November 22, 2016; assessment performed as the request of the District

• wNMCI score 35.63%

From 2008 until 2016 assessments were not performed at Velarde Elementary School. After a school is awarded funding by the PSCOC, assessments for the awarded facility do not occur, based on the fact that the facilities will be either renovated or replaced. For the past five years the school has remained in the previously funded section of the PSCOC ranked list.

Weighted New Mexico Condition Index (wNMCI) scores are made up of various categories that represent certain deficiencies. The definition for the categories mentioned in this memo are:

Category 2- degraded with potential mission impact, meaning a system is beyond its expected life and may affect other systems if left as is. For example you will note that the plumbing in the gym is set to a category 2, meaning the system is in serious disrepair and failure may be imminent.

Category 3 - mitigate additional damage, meaning a systems that if left as is will cause additional damage, such as a leaking roof, may cause water damage to the walls or disable the lights.

Category 4 - beyond expected life, meaning systems or deficiencies that are 100% to 200% beyond their expected life, but exhibit no sign of immediate repair requirements. Such as most interior finishes not severely damaged or torn.

Category 9- normal/within life cycle, meaning a system that is within its projected or estimated useful life cycle and does not need replacement.

The following deficiencies were previously noted in the October 12, 2016 assessment and any changes from the November 22, 2016 are listed below.

- **★** The roof over the original 1932 building is a category 3, mitigate additional damage, with a weight factor of 2.0. (**no change**)
- ♣ All the windows in the 1932 building are category 4, beyond expected life, with a weight factor of 0.25; indicating more deficiencies contributing to the wNMCI score.
 - o **Change** Previously half of the windows were set to category 4, beyond expected life with a weight factor of 0.25. The interior of the 1932 building were improved in 2013 with a storm wood window insert, while the exterior was left as is.
- ♣ Mini Splits (heating and cooling units) were installed in 2013, and are a category 9, within expected life, with a weight factor of 0.25.
 - o **Change** All other HVAC in the 1932 building were set to 1995, and are within expected life; indicating more deficiencies contributing to the wNMCI score.
 - Noted: the classrooms farthest from the HVAC do not receive any heat (maintenance issue)
 - O Change The HVAC on the 1982 section of the building that connects the 1955 and the 1932 buildings are original and set to beyond expected life, category 4, with a weight factor of 0.25 previously set to within expected life with a weight factor of 0.25; indicating more deficiencies contributing to the wNMCI score.
 - **Change** The restrooms in the 1955 gym were set to a category 2, degraded with potential mission impact, with a weight factor of 1.5; previously set as category 9, within expected life, with a weight factor of 0.25; indicating more deficiencies contributing to the wNMCI score.
- ♣ Floor finishes extended life; Wood floors were in good condition with some areas such as closet and gym floors needing to be refinished, but in good condition. (No change to wood floors)
 - o **Change** The carpet in the 1932 building were set to a category 4, beyond expected life, with a weight factor of 0.25 indicating more deficiencies contributing to the wNMCI score.
- **Exterior Walls**

Noted: The exterior stucco finish on the 1932 building is damaged, but the structural integrity of the exterior walls appear to be uncompromised and in good condition.

Per the previously issued Memo dated October 18, 2016; below are the reasons why the wNMCI score has improved from 55.94% in 2008 to 35.63% in 2016.

The original award indicated a design capacity of 157 students, which would have required more educational space than is now needed based on the lower enrollment; the certified 2015-2016 40 day count enrollment of 74. The calculation for space issues is tied to enrollment numbers resulting in an improved wNMCI score.

Spaces such as the following are affected by the calculation:

- ♣ library (stacks and seating 3 net sq ft per student
- dining (15 net sq ft per student)
- **♣** administration (1.5 sq ft x school enrolled; 150 min)
- **♣** parent work space (1 net sq ft per student; 150 min)
- **♣** student health (1 sq ft x student capacity; 150 min)
- ♣ faculty workspace/teacher lounge (1 net sq ft per student; 150 min)

Replacement or extended life based upon condition contribute to a better score. The following improvements/corrections were previously noted in the October 12, 2016 assessment, and do not reflect any change from the November 22, 2016.

- ♣ Interior Wall finishes extended life; painted but not patched correctly (**no change**)
- ♣ Air Ventilation extended life 1955 addition (**no change**)
- ♣ Septic System –in 2013 a new septic was installed (**no change**)

II. Item Title: Farmington – P10-003 – Tibbetts MS – Demolition of Old Tibbetts MS

III. Name of Presenter(s): Casandra Cano, Programs Support Manager

IV. Potential Motion:

Approve the request from the Farmington Municipal Schools to maintain funding from project closeout in the amount of \$936,000 to complete demolition of the Old Tibbetts MS, at a state share of \$552,240 (59%), and a corresponding district share of \$383,760 (41%). Demolition must be complete within 12 months of this approval.

V. Executive Summary:

This project was included in the FY2017 PSCOC project closeout list. Substantial completion on the new Tibbetts MS was reached in March 2013, after which time the Old Tibbetts MS became vacant. The district used the vacant school as swing space (temporary campus) during the construction of Hermosa MS, which assisted with project savings for both the district and the state. Substantial completion was reached on Hermosa MS in August 2015, and therefore the temporary campus at the Old Tibbetts MS was no longer needed. The district is now ready to proceed with demolition of the Old Tibbetts MS.

Staff recommends that the PSCOC approve the district request to reaffirm the demolition funding as part of the Tibbetts MS project.

Pursuant to our conversation last week, I hereby request consideration by the PSCOC to confirm funding for the demolition of the old Tibbetts MS.

This was part of the original MOU for this project and the original estimate for demolition was \$936,000. The state portion of this aspect of the award for the new Tibbetts MS is 59% or \$552,240.

In order to provide a little background on this aspect of the project not being completed as of the present is the fact that the old Tibbetts MS was used as a temporary campus for Hermosa MS while Hermosa was being constructed.

By utilizing the existing facility the owner was able to realize savings for various reasons. Some of these reasons included an expedited time frame for construction of the new Hermosa MS by decreasing Design Professional Fees and Contractor General Condition Fees, as well as reduced construction costs due to a one-year construction period vs. a two-year construction period. Further cost savings were realized by the elimination of the need for a significant number of portables that would have been required throughout the construction process. Finally, we believe there were non-quantifiable reasons for utilizing the old Tibbetts MS campus related to student and staff safety while the construction process was ongoing.

The original amount committed by the PSCOC in the MOU for this project was \$20,060,000.00. At this point in time the total expenditures by the PSFA for this project total \$13,381,845.41, leaving a balance to be reverted to the PSCOC of \$6,678,154.59. PSCOC participation in the demolition portion of this project will still leave a significant portion of the original funds committed by the PSCOC for this project to be reverted.

The district hereby requests that the funds originally committed by the PSCOC for the demolition portion of this project (\$552,240 + NMGRT) be reaffirmed and that the balance of the funds remaining be reverted as soon as possible to the PSCOC.

We are in receipt of your emails of 12 December 2016 and your questions therein. Following are answers to those questions in the order that they were posed.

- 1. The district has committed all funds from the existing 2014 bond towards present projects, however, the district may be able to absorb a small increase in our portion of the demolition project of the old Tibbetts MS. The existing split for this project had a district participation of 41% and we would be willing to increase our share to 50%.
- 2. The cost of insurance and operational utilities for the old Tibbetts MS is \$113,000 per year. This does not include costs related to ongoing maintenance and repair of vandalism which has increased in the past year.
- 3. The district's operational fund balance was \$6.3M as of 30 June 2016 and our district capital funds (which are fully committed at this time) were \$30.0M. This equates to a percentage of operational to capital funds of 21%.
- 4. There is a significant need to move forward with the demolition as soon as possible due to the fact the operational costs continue to be a significant burden on the district and the additional maintenance costs and repairs of vandalism tax our plant operations resources. Our plan is to move forward with demolition as soon as confirmation is received from the PSCOC to reinstate the demolition funds that were awarded as part of the original MOU for the construction of the new Tibbetts MS.

5. Finally, your additional question of what the original portable campus would have been is purely hypothetical based upon the scenario that was presented to the PSCOC as part of the Hermosa MS project. The rough estimate was for \$420,000 and that included installation and removal. It did not include the cost of purchasing portables or transporting them to the site nor transporting them away from the site. Based upon recent portable installations at the ongoing Farmington High School project, transportation costs ran about \$12,000 per portable. These same costs would be incurred upon completion of the project to move them off campus and return them to their original source or a location the PSFA specifies. Finally, this assumes that portables would have been available at the time of the project commencing, which they were not (other than purchasing some at discount from the Clovis School District). Assuming we would have had to purchase 4 of the 7 portables required, that would have been an additional expense of \$320,000 (\$80,000 per unit). To summarize:

PSFA has determined that this is not a to adequacy cost because the Enrichment Center was not included in the award language and because the building is not impacted as a result of the current project.

The cost of the demolition is estimated to be \$361,167. Participation in the demolition of the Enrichment Center could be accommodated by the current funding and would not result in a change to the overall PSCOC award.

The original award did state that disposal of the old abandoned high school could be considered in a future award cycle. However, subsequent awards did not include language permitting the disposal of the building. Attached, please find minutes from the January 3, 2014, where they district testified that they would be willing to "take the hit" on funding the enrichment center.



The district is requesting design services funding to complete design in accordance with education specification recommendations to include renovation/replacement of Lordsburg High School, consolidation of Southside ES to RV Traylor, and consolidation of Central ES to RV Traylor ES and Dugan-Tarango MS. The district has in place their required funding amount match totaling \$942,500 (65%).

Executive Summary: Staff recommends a Phase 1 amendment to the 2013-2014 standards-based awards to Lordsburg Municipal Schools for Lordsburg High School for Phase 1 design funding to renovate/replace facilities to adequacy for 480 students, grades K-12 with an increase in the state share amount of \$507,500 (35%), contingent upon an additional local share of \$942,500 (65%).

Consolidation of five facilities into three; demolition of two (Central ES-2 and Old HS), sale of one (Southside ES-14) and renovation of one (Lordsburg HS-10).

Mr. Volpato reported that the district has four schools that are under-utilized and have excess space. The current high school needs a facility to move student while renovation is under-way. The district has determined that it would be in their best interest to move the high school students into the Central Elementary School during the project. The sixth grade students from Central ES would move to Dugan-Tarango Middle School while the fifth grade students from Central ES would move to the RV Traylor Elementary. The third and fourth graders from the Southside Elementary would also move into RV Traylor ES, leaving the Southside Elementary and later to be disposed. Moving the students would eliminate the need for a portables campus.

Superintendent Randy Piper represented the Lordsburg School District. He stated that there are three buildings with just under 70 students attending. The decision to move students and eliminate schools came for their utilization study. He noted that there is another building that needs to be demolished which he is willing to "take the hit on it" that is a national historical building. However, the roof caved in and cannot be repaired. The district is prepared to begin consolidation within the next school year. Mr. Piper is prepared to go before PED to ask for a consolidation of Southside Elementary for next year and look at Central Elementary in the future. He informed the Council that the school board approved an amended five-year facility master plan and all the above consolidation and closures are included in the plan. The school board and the community are in support of the master plan.

Ms. Cano pointed out that the financial plan has increased plans to accommodate a potential local match reduction. The district is eligible for a local match reduction. The district intends to return to the Council for a waiver of a portion of their local share. The out-year funding for Phase II construction has been pledged for this type of request.

Amend the 2015-2016 standards-based award to the Roswell Independent Schools for Del Norte Elementary to include design for replacement of the facilities to adequacy for 576 students, grades K-5. The total project estimate to adequacy is reduced to \$22,000,000; the financial plan shall be adjusted to reflect a reduced state share for out-of-cycle awards for design and construction.

The district may proceed with design at 100% district funding at this time at a cost of \$2,100,000. The corresponding state share of the design phase in the amount of \$1,533,000 (73%) may be released for expenditure in the third quarter of calendar year 2017 pending funding availability and final approval by the PSCOC; at which time the district funding for the design phase will be reduced by the state share amount.

V. Executive Summary:

Staff recommends that the PSCOC approve the district request to proceed with design prior to the release of funding. This request is to proceed with design only. The district has funding in place and is concerned about potential arbitrage issues if the project does not begin soon. Funding for the design portion of the project is currently in 2017 Q3 in the PSCOC adopted financial plan. The state share of the design request is \$1,533,000, with a corresponding district share of \$567,000. Until PSCOC design funding is available, the district will accommodate the entire design funding amount of \$2,100,000.

Additionally, staff recommends an Award Language Change to amend the award to state "planning and design funding to replace Del Norte ES for 576 students, grades K-5". At the time of the award, design capacity was not yet determined. Staff recommends a design capacity of 576 based upon an analysis of enrollment projections and the district approved master plan. Further, at the time of the award a staff recommendation could not be made for renovation or replacement. Based upon the Building Systems Analysis Report and staff analysis, it appears that the cost of renovation and addition in order to accommodate the design capacity would be 80 to 90 percent of the cost of replacement. Based upon this return on investment, staff recommendation is to participate in replacement to adequacy.

Finally, staff recommends an out-year-estimate update to reduce the anticipated total project cost to \$22,000,000 from \$26,417,469. The phase 2 PSCOC share will reduce from \$17,356,277 to \$14,454,000 for a phase 2 state share reduction of \$2,902,277.

This memo provides the basis for the design capacity of 576 for the redesign of Del Norte Elementary School in the Roswell Independent School District. As of the 2015-16 school year, the school's enrollment totaled **595** students. The award language states:

Funding to complete district-utilization study based on geocode analysis, new educational specifications, and analysis of major building systems. Upon completion, district may return to PSCOC for next out-of-cycle funding phase and approval of options to renovate/replace and total student capacity to adequacy

At the time of the award, the district was in the process of preparing a new Facilities Master Plan, which includes a detailed utilization and capacity analysis satisfying the utilization study requirement. To satisfy the geocode analysis, the district provide PSFA staff student location addresses, which PSFA GIS staff used to determine the number of students living in each elementary school's attendance boundaries. The FMP also contained enrollment projections for each elementary school.

Based on the geocode analysis, the utilization/capacity analysis provided in the FMP, and the FMP's enrollment projection, the FMP recommended a design capacity of 576 for the redesigned Del Norte Elementary school. PSFA staff concurs with the FMP capacity recommendation based on the number of students living in the Del Norte Attendance Boundaries (as of last year's enrollment counts) and projection of 582 students for Del Norte in 2020-21.

IV. Executive Summary (Informational):

Included is a draft of the problem statements, potential solutions and potential statute revisions pertaining to the charter lease assistance program.

This document incorporates responses from the workgroup formed to address charter lease assistance statute and recommended language changes. There are remaining items in which the workgroup has not received consensus on and decisions still remain within the workgroup.

A summary of the remaining items requiring consensus are:

- Require charter schools to use existing school facility space that may also include PSCOC or district owned portables. The workgroup differed on this position on whether to add to statute or not and is not included in the draft.
- Item 1.b. 22-26-26A-4(B) the workgroup differed on who is responsible for the final review and approval of final lease purchase arrangements either PSCOC or PED (Department as referred to in current language).
- Item 3.a. 22-24-4(I) the workgroup differed on the language regarding administrative spaces that was added. Reasoning: there is no mechanism to make payments to charter schools for leased space.
- Item 4.a. 22-24-4(I)(1)(b) the workgroup differed on the language regarding determination of the per mem amount and language on classroom space. Clarification in language that any payment made is for classroom space that is actively used by mem is required.
- During the AMS Subcommittee, suggestion was made to clarify in Item 3.a. who (governing board, etc...) certifies no public space available.
- During the Awards Subcommittee, suggestion was made to review statute regarding the amount of lease assistance awarded to the charter schools.
 In light of recent revenue reductions and the increasing amount of

funding to the program over the years, discussion surrounding the amount of 2016-2017 lease assistance is recommended. This item pertains to 4.a. consider removal or reduction of (\$700) multiplied by the number of mem as adjusted by statute.										
These items are for your review and discussion.										

Potential Solutions

Background Statement:

This memo is the result of a workgroup comprised of PSCOC Members, LESC Staff, and PSFA Staff. Significant discussion surrounded the topic of charter school lease oversight and compliance with statute 22.8B-4.2. As a result of escalating lease reimbursement costs, enforcement roadblocks and inadequate authorizer oversight, the workgroup proposes the following suggestions for the Public School Capital Outlay Oversight Taskforce's consideration.

1. Problem Statement(s)

a. Explicit responsibility for oversight of leases and lease purchase agreements and enforcement of as cited in Section 22-8B-4.2 is unclear as it references the (authorizer, the Public Education Commission or the local school district, Public Education Department as it relates to Public School Lease Purchase Act (Chapter 22, Article 26A NMSA 1978) and/or the PSCOC).

1. Potential Solutions

- a. The [PED or PSCOC (pick-one)] must be ultimately responsible for ensuring that all leases comply with all NMSA 1978 statutes.
- b. Lease purchase agreements and leases must be approved by Public Education

 Department (PED) and any revisions of the lease purchase agreement prior to execution

1. Potential Statute Revisions

- a. Section 22-8B-4.2 F. The public school capital outlay council:
 - (1) Shall determine whether facilities of the charter school meet the educational occupancy standards pursuant to the requirements of Subsection A through D of this section or the requirement of Subsections B, C and D of this section, as applicable; and
 - (2) Upon a determination that specific requirements are not appropriate or reasonable for a charter school, may grant a variance from those requirements for that charter school.
- a. Section 22-8B-4.2 (add new section G). The [PED or PSCOC (pick-one)]:
 - (1) <u>Shall determine whether leases meet all requirements of this Section in its entirety, and 22-26A-4; and</u>

- (2) <u>Upon a determination that specific requirements are not appropriate or reasonable for a charter school, may grant a variance from those requirements for that charter school.</u>
- b. 22-26A-4(B) [revise language] A governing body shall not enter into a lease purchase arrangement without the approval of the department; final review and approval by the department (PED) is required for the final lease purchase arrangement prior to execution by the parties.

2. Problem Statement(s)

a. Charters lack capacity to properly enter into and administer lease agreements.

2. **Potential Solutions**

a. Require the use of a Public School Capital Outlay Council (PSCOC) and Public Education Department (PED) adopted standardized lease and lease purchase agreement.

2. Potential Statute Revisions

a. 22-24-4 [add new section I.(7)] The charter school shall utilize the adopted standardized lease and lease purchase agreement.

3. Problem Statement(s)

a. Unnecessary proliferation of gross square footage of public schools.

3. **Potential Solutions**

 Ensure that existing educational space is fully utilized prior to adding additional space by building or leasing. Additionally, ensure that non-educational space is not included in state funding.

3. Potential Statute Revisions

- a. 22-8B-4.2 (C) On or after July 1, 2011, a new charter school shall not open and existing charter school shall not relocate unless <u>certification of no availability of public facilities</u> is submitted to the Public School Capital Outlay Council; and, the facilities of the new or relocated charter school, as measured by the New Mexico condition index, receive a condition rating equal to or better than the statewide average condition for all New Mexico public schools for that year demonstrates the way in which the facilities will achieve a rating equal to or better than the average New Mexico condition index. facilities of the new or relocated charter school, as measured by the New Mexico condition index, receive a condition rating equal to or better than the statewide average condition for all New Mexico public schools for that year or shall, within eighteen months of occupancy, achieve the required condition.
- a. 22-24-4(I). The fund may be expended annually by the council for grants to school districts for the purpose of making lease payments for classroom facilities, including facilities leased by charter schools <u>but not including administrative spaces</u> leased by charter schools. The grants shall be made upon application by the school districts and charter schools pursuant to rules adopted by the council;

- a. 22-24-4(I)(6)(b)"classroom facilities" or "classroom space" includes the space needed, as determined by the minimum required under the statewide adequacy standards, for the district administration of school activities and does not include administrative space use.
- a. 22-24-4(I)(6)(c) add new section: Charter schools shall self-report to the PED {Note-this should be the same entity (PED or PSCOC) that is responsible in 22-8B-4.2 that ensures lease compliance} any changes in lease language, exercising options to purchase or any change in physical location.

4. Problem Statement(s)

a. Decreased funding from the Supplemental Severance Tax Bonds (SSTBs) resulting from oil and gas revenues and passage of 2016 Special Session legislation SB4 and SB8.

4. Potential Solutions Include:

a. Consider removal or reduction of (\$700) multiplied by the number of MEM.

4. Potential Statute Revisions:

a. 22-24-4(I)(1)(b) Seven hundred dollars (\$700) An amount determined annually by the PSCOC multiplied by the number of MEM using lease classroom facilities; provided that in fiscal year 2009 and in each subsequent fiscal year, this amount may be adjusted as a percentage change between the penultimate calendar year and the immediately preceding calendar year of the consumer price index for the United States, all items, as published by the United States department of labor. Charter school lease assistance reimbursements is for classroom space actively used by MEM.

Closing Statement:

In closing, cost effectiveness of leases and over proliferation of educational space is an ongoing concern. Lease reimbursement costs have risen significantly over the past 10 years, while supplemental severance tax bonds available for public school projects have sharply declined over the past 5 years. The question is, how do we manage increased costs of charter school lease reimbursements and what can we do to foster a sustainable inventory of public school facilities? Continuous data analysis by Charter School Division and PSCOC/PSFA will be required.

Attached is the PSFA FY17 Operating Budget with 5.5% savings. The calculated savings equates to \$332.2K bringing the budget amount from \$6,039.7M to \$5,707.5M. The PSFA has not rehired vacated positions in FY17. Included is an FTE worksheet showing the detail of these positions.

During the course of the year, PSFA negotiated a savings on the Vanderweil Facility Advisors (VFA) (FAD) contract in the amount of \$113.0K. Historically, the VFA contract was \$211.9K annually. The amount for FY17 was negotiated to \$98.9K. PSFA was unable to realize this savings for FY17 as the E-Builder contract expense was transferred from the Capital Fund (94700) to the Operational Fund (94300). The FY17 amount for the E-Builder contract is


\$131.9K. Thus, resulting in an \$18.9K un-budgeted expenditure. A BAR was not submitted as the 400s expenditure is able to absorb the expense. The FY17 E-Builder contract was prorated for nine months to bring the contract terms within alignment of fiscal year dates. The FY18 E-Builder contract amount will be \$175.8K.

The FY18 Budget submission included a 1.0 FTE reduction for Administrative Assistant I. Total savings including benefits is \$64.7K.

Through attrition, maintaining the same FTE levels as forecasted in FY17 would allow the FY18 Operational Budget to continue flat at \$5.7M. Further reductions to the operational budget would require restructuring of the agency. Management will develop options.



IV. **Executive Summary (Informational):**

The MOU between PSFA and CID was signed in 2007 with the intent to give PSCOC funded projects priority over other construction projects in both expedited plan review and inspection.

The MOU states the goal for plan review turn-around time is five business days. Building inspections are to occur within 48 hours of request.

PSFA and CID are to report performance goals to the PSCOC at least quarterly. In return for these services PSCOC agreed to reimburse CID for any expenditures made for permitting and inspection activity (CID services).

At the time of the agreement in 2007 PSCOC would reimburse at the rate of \$152.32 per inspection. This price increased in 2008 to \$193.72 per inspection, based on a cost analysis provided by CID to the PSCOC.

Below is the NMSA that permits this expenditure:

NMSA 1978 Section 22-24-4

J. In addition to other authorized expenditures from the fund, up to one percent of the average grant assistance authorized from the fund during the three previous fiscal years may be expended in each fiscal year by the public school facilities authority to pay the state fire marshal, the construction industries division of the regulation and licensing department and local jurisdictions having authority from the state to permit and inspect projects for expenditures made to permit and inspect projects funded in whole or in part under the Public School Capital Outlay Act. The authority may enter into contracts with the state fire marshal, the construction industries division or the appropriate local authorities to carry out the provisions of this subsection. Such a contract may provide for initial estimated payments from the fund prior to the expenditures if the contract also provides for additional payments from the fund if the actual expenditures exceed the initial payments and for repayments back to the fund if the initial payments exceed the actual expenditures. Money distributed from the fund to the state fire marshal or the construction industries division pursuant to this subsection shall be used to supplement, rather than supplant, appropriations to those entities

As requested, the following information is presented:

The purpose is to explain why and how CID prioritizes Plan Reviews and required scheduled field inspections for PSCOC projects. Attached please fine a copy of the Contract between the Public School Facilities Authority and the Regulation and Licensing Department for the benefit of Construction of Public School Facilities throughout the State of New Mexico.

Also attached is a copy of the Performance Measures for FY16 showing our goals of implementation and our actual performance toward those goals. We have projected the same goals of performance for FY17 & FY18.

It should be noted that we have had issues, where we are notified by PSFA that they have not received our completed plan reviews in a timely manner, when in fact, our records indicate that they were sent to PSFA. When we receive these request form PSFA, we resend the approved Plans immediately. We are trying to ascertain just what the problem might be from an IT standpoint. Recently, it has been explained that each party, both PSFA and CID have 7 days to respond to plans that are sent electronically. If they are logged in within that 7day time period, they are voided. Again, we are working with one another to ensure that all sent electronic plans are received and accepted, logged in, within the 7 day window. If after sending an electronic submittal we have not heard back we have agreed follow up by sending an email or calling the agency to ensure they know that a submittal of plans has been sent.

As noted in the attached contract, CID and PSFA agree that performance is the primary purpose for this agreement. Performance includes speedy and reliable delivery of quality CID services and performance goals shall Be:

Quality plan review and turn around inclusive of permitting.

Time is critical to PSCOC projects. The goal for Plan review turn-around time is five business days. The parties will make every effort to better this goal; and

Timely, complete, and quality inspections help ensure quality of construction and maintaining of schedules for PSCOC projects.

The goal for inspections is 48 hours from contractor request into CID ACCELA system, call center or similar inspection request and tracking system. The parties

will make every effort to better this goal.

STATE OF NEW MEXICO CONTRACT BETWEEN THE PUBLIC SCHOOL FACILITIES AUTHORITY AND

THE REGULATION AND LICENSING DEPARTMENT FOR THE BENEFIT OF CONSTRUCTION OF PUBLIC SCHOOL FACILITIES #00-000-0000

This agreement is made and entered into by and between the State of New Mexico, Regulation and Licensing Department, (RLD), acting through Edward Lopez, its superintendent (Superintendent), on behalf of the Construction Industries Division (CID) of RLD, and the State of New Mexico Public Schools Facilities Authority (PSFA), for the purpose of PSFA providing reimbursement of expenditures incurred by CID for the purpose of permitting and inspecting projects funded under the Public School Capital Outlay Act.

A. BACKGROUND.

- Time is critical to PSCOC projects. The Public School Capital Outlay Council (PSCOC) and the Public School Capital Outlay Oversight Task Force recognize the critical part CID's services provide to PSCOC projects in its endeavor towards speedy delivery of quality construction of schools.
- 2. Senate Bill 455 (Laws 2005, Chapter 274) was passed in the 2005 legislative session, and signed into law on April 6, 2005, and this contract is effective as of July 1, 2005.
- 3. One of the provisions of Senate Bill 455 authorizes the PSFA to expend up to one percent of the average grant assistance authorized from the Public School Capital Outlay Fund during the three previous years to reimburse CID, the State Fire Marshall and any authorized local jurisdiction for expenditures made by these entities to permit and inspect projects funded in whole or in part under the Public School Capital Outlay Act.
- 4. The bill provides that the PSFA shall enter into a contract with CID to carry out the reimbursement provisions of the bill.
- **B. TERMS AND CONDITIONS.** In consideration of and as a condition of the reimbursements made pursuant to this Agreement, and other valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which consideration is acknowledged here, the parties agree as follows:
 - 1. <u>Reimbursement.</u> The PSFA shall reimburse CID for expenditures (expenditures) made by CID for permitting and inspection activity (CID services) funded in whole or in part under the Public School Outlay Act (each a PSCOC project) as follows:
 - a. CID and PSFA agree that performance is the primary purpose for this agreement. Performance includes speedy and reliable delivery of quality CID services that includes;
 - 1) quality plan review and turn around inclusive of permitting. Time is critical to PSCOC projects. The goal for plan review turn-around time

- will be five business days. The parties will make every effort to better this goal; and,
- 2) timely, complete, and quality inspections to help ensure quality of construction and maintaining of schedules for PSCOC projects. The goal for inspections will be 48 hours from contractor request into PSFA Construction Information Management System (CIMS). The parties will make every effort to better this goal.
- b. CID and PSFA will provide reporting on performance goals to PSCOC at least quarterly.
- c. CID agrees that good communication bound with accountability is the best way to ensure speedy delivery of quality construction and will participate in logging, reporting and tracking PSCOC projects within the CIMS that will provide e-mails and reporting of all critical time events and correspondence.
- d. CID and PSFA will work collaboratively toward continuous improvement of the delivery of PSCOC projects.
- e. Prior to each Fiscal Quarter parties shall mutually agree on a not-toexceed dollar amount projected to be needed based upon PSFA estimated work.
- f. Allowed reimbursement will be calculated by CID per attachment "A" that may be amended by PSCOC from time to time, and
 - 1) no later than the 10th calendar day of each fiscal quarter, CID will submit to PSFA an invoice showing the expenditures, with supporting documentation, expressed in unit costs, made by CID in the previous calendar quarter on all PSCOC projects in that previous fiscal quarter.
- g. No later than the date on which the first month of each fiscal quarter ends, PSFA shall transfer funds in the amount shown on the CID invoice for the previous fiscal quarter to CID, or will provide written documentation as to why payment, in whole or in part, cannot be made.
- h. PSCOC has the right to require CID to submit additional documentation of expenditures for which reimbursement is claimed.
- i. RLD will deposit these funds in a separate CID fund and may only be budgeted towards CID services for PSCOC projects.

2. Reconciliation.

a. If there is a discrepancy between the PSFA records of CID services and any CID invoice for services, the PSFA will notify CID of the discrepancy within ten (10) working days after receipt of the affected CID invoice. The PSFA will submit supporting documentation with any notice of discrepancy.

- b. CID will review the notice and documentation and if an error was made on the invoice, CID will submit a corrected invoice. If no error is apparent, the agencies shall work together in good faith to resolve the discrepancy. If the discrepancy cannot be resolved after a reasonable period of time not to exceed thirty (30) days, the lower number of services shall be deemed to be correct.
- 3. Term. This Agreement shall terminate on the last day of the fiscal quarter following the fiscal quarter in which all PSCOC funded projects are completed, unless terminated earlier pursuant paragraph 5, below.
- 4. Termination. This Agreement may be terminated by either of the parties hereto upon written notice delivered to the other party at least ninety (90) days prior to the intended date of termination. By such termination, neither party may nullify obligations already incurred for performance or failure to perform prior to the date of termination.
- 5. Appropriations. The terms of this Agreement are contingent upon sufficient appropriations and authorization being made by the Legislature of New Mexico for the performance of this Agreement. If sufficient appropriations and authorization are not made by the Legislature, this Agreement shall terminate after such reimbursement as is afforded by the funding available to PSFA as of the date of the most recent unpaid CID invoice for CID services performed on any PSCOC project.

BACKGROUND

During the 2005 Legislative Session, Senate Bill 455 was passed and subsequently signed into law. This legislation addresses a number of issues relating to Public School Capital Outlay. Among the issues addressed is the considerable amount of resources expended by the Construction Industries Division (CID) in support of the critically important on-going needs of New Mexico public schools.

Senate Bill 455 provides "in addition to other authorized expenditures from the Public School Capital Outlay fund, up to one percent of the average grant assistance authorized from the fund during the three previous fiscal years may be expended in each fiscal year by the public school facilities authority to reimburse the state fire marshal, the construction industries division of the regulation and licensing department and local jurisdictions... for expenditures made to permit and inspect projects funded in whole or in part under the Public School Capital Outlay Act. The authority shall enter into contracts with the state fire marshal, the construction industries division or the appropriate local authorities..."

At this time, the Construction Industries Division (CID) is requesting grant assistance (reimbursement funds) from the revenue source provided in Senate Bill 455 for expenditures made by CID to permit and inspect projects in 2006 that were funded under the Public School Capital Outlay Act. The Division requests review from the Public School Capital Outlay Council Awards Subcommittee on January 3, 2007 for an allocation of \$240,100 to CID. The Division further requests formal approval or the reimbursement from the Public School Capital Outlay Council on January 6, 2007. Upon approval of the reimbursement, CID requests that \$240,100 be reimbursed to the Division through its Capital Budget account established at the Department of Finance and Administration.

As a part of this request, CID certifies that in 2006, at least \$240,100 of expenditures were made by the Division to permit and inspect public school projects funded through the Public School Capital Outlay Act.

The MOUs for the projects approved by the E-rate program and by the PSCOC are finalized or are being executed. Preparations for the construction phase are under way.

Several RFPs for WAN fiber projects are posted, with additional procurements expected in the coming weeks. Districts are engaging libraries and municipalities to accomplish economies of scale and coordinate and streamline permitting and Rights-Of-Way (ROW) review process.

PSFA, with assistance from PED and the DoIT, organized a meeting with the Cat2 (Network Equipment) vendors in November, in preparation for the 2017 E-rate cycle.

Multiple districts and charters are in the process of developing network equipment upgrade projects for the next E-rate cycle.

PED is updating the MiniQuotes portal that will support the statewide agreements for equipment and Internet Access. A training session with vendors and schools is scheduled in January 2017.

The pricing agreements for the statewide RFP for Internet Access developed by PED and DoIT will be available in January 2017.

Governor Susana Martinez is working with the NM Congressional delegation to urge USAC to expedite the review/approval process for the NM broadband projects.



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



V. Executive Summary (Informational):

The New Mexico PSCOC Maintenance Program Status Report is a quarterly statewide maintenance performance metric developed from PSFA statute required and managed maintenance data. It identifies NM School Districts status regarding their maintenance program in the following 4 major functions:

- 1) Preventive Maintenance Plans (PMP: statute:) A statute driven, written plan on how the districts will operate maintenance management programs at their respective schools, inclusive of goals, staffing plans & other good business practice and methods towards good stewardship of quality and safe facilities and proper preservation of building systems and components (required state statute).
- 2) Facility Information Management System (FIMS) A software tool to assist school districts manage their maintenance programs reactive, preventive maintenance and utility collection activities, through inventories, improved processes and reporting, currently provided by School Dude, to better manage their overall assets and maintenance operations.
- 3) Facility Maintenance Assessment Report (FMAR) Building site assessments based on industry and federal building management standards to evaluate how well a district site is being maintained and the capital investment protected.
 - a. 2016 FMAR Status b. FMAR Completion Rate
- **4) Meaningful Maintenance Metrics** (**M**³) A monthly maintenance report that is developed from district's FIMS data. This report is intended to communicate data driven maintenance and operations activities to the district's staff and leadership in an effort to make better informed decisions regarding their facilities.

Current New Mexico Maintenance Program Status:

- 1) PM Plan Currency Rate (monthly performance metric): 72.53% of the districts have a current PM plan. 27.47% have not updated their PM plans. This metric has improved considerably since last quarter (59.34%).
- 2) FIMS Proficiency use (quarterly performance metric) 2Q-2016: Percent of districts using the products to manage districts maintenance: Maintenance Direct (MD): 64.84%. Preventive Maintenance Direct (PMD): 71.43%. Utility Direct (UD): 73.63%.
- **3) FMAR** (monthly metric):
 - a. FY16 FMAR Status: Average score 65.09%.
 - **b.** FMAR Completion Rate: 466 of 784 completed. 59.43% Statewide Completion Rate with an estimated 3 year statewide review cycle.
- 4) Meaningful Maintenance Metrics (M³): 13.2% of districts are verified users of the monthly report with 1 new district using the report feature Alamogordo School District.



IV. Executive Summary (Informational):

The spreadsheet included is the working draft of a potential revision to the Funding Formula.

The scenario uses the district's financial capacity to determine a new proposed local match percentage. In addition, to account for the scale advantage that larger districts have, the local share was weighted for population density and location within a U.S. Census recognized Urbanized area. Lastly, additional percentage points were added to the state side to allow for local prioritization to those districts with less than 105% capacity above need.

Option 3 –

Adequacy Gross Square Footage – Weighted for Population Density

- 1. Each district's final valuation and bonding capacity was used to determine available year to year debt service revenue (Column B). This figure is used to determine what the financial capacity of each district is.
- To create an annualized amortization schedule for each district, the Adequacy Planning Guide (APG) GSF footprint (Column C) was created using the Certified 40th day enrollment count from the Public Education Department.
- 3. The APG GSF was multiplied by \$320 per square foot replacement cost (Column D) and divided by 45 years to determine the annualized amortization (Column E).

APG GSF x \$320 = Total Replacement Cost /45 Years = Annualized Amortization



Option 3. Calculating New Local Share (Column J)

The new local share was calculated by taking the Debt Service Revenue and dividing it by the Annualized Amortization (Column F).

Debt Service Revenue (4.48 Mills)		Annualized Amortization (45 Years)	=	Percent of Amortization that can be covered by Debt Service Revenue (Proposed Local Share)
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Option 3. Modifying for Population Density (Column L)

To adjust for population density, if a district can not cover more than 90% of the Annualized Amortization (Column f) costs, then:

- An additional 10% is added to the state share for districts with a population density ranging from 0-15 people per square mile; or
- An additional 5% is added to the state share for districts with a population density ranging from 15.01 to 50 people per square mile.

There are 49 districts that will receive additional state share percentage points.

- 43 districts will receive an additional 10%
- 6 districts will receive an additional 5%

There are 27 districts that do not receive additional percentage points, despite having a population density ranging between 0-50 people per square mile, because they can cover 90% or more of their Annualized Amortization costs.

The remaining 13 districts do not qualify for a population density adjustment.



Option 3. Modifying for Urbanized Areas (Column M)

If a district is not located within a U.S. Census recognized Urbanized Area, then:

An additional 3% is added to the state share.

There are 84 districts that will receive the additional percentage points. The five districts that will not are:

- Albuquerque;
- Las Cruces;
- Farmington;
- Los Lunas; and
- Santa Fe.



Option 3. Modifying for Local Priority Incentives (Column N)

If a district can not cover more than 105% of the Annualized Amortization (column f) costs, then:

• An additional 5% is added to the state share.

There are 63 districts that will receive the additional percentage points.

There are 26 districts that do not receive additional percentage points because they can cover 105% or more of their Annualized Amortization costs.



Option 3. Data Needed/Proposed Process

Existing processes will support the needed data without modification.

- In January of each year, PED will issue the certified 40th Day Count.
- In February of each year, PSFA will obtain certified land valuations from the Tax & Revenue Department.

New Processes:

- Using the certified count, PSFA will determine APG GSF Footprint and submit to PSCOC for adoption during their April meeting.
- Using the certified land valuations, PSFA will create annualized amortization schedules, weight them for population and submit to the PSCOC for approval and adoption during their April meeting.





Pros –

- Fewer calculations than existing formula requires and more closely aligns help to those that need it.
- The population density modification adjusts scale disadvantages of rural districts.
- Will help encourage schools to "right-size", or reduce excess square footage and lowers State funding needed.
- Underutilized space will have a state funding penalty.
- Cost to sustain schools will reduce over time.
- 35 districts would see a reduction in their local share amount.

Cons -

- Existing funding shortfall will continue to depend on the State of New Mexico filling the gap (waivers will still be needed).
- 52 Districts will receive less funding from the State.
- The previous approximate 50% State/50% Local split will shift to 43% State/57% Local





Modifications:

If district can't cover more than 90% of amortization costs then:

- Additional 10% is added on the State share for districts with a population density ranging from 0-15
- Additional 5% is added on the State share for districts with a population density ranging from 15.001 to 50

If a district is not a U.S. Census designated Urbanized Area, an additional 3% points are added to the State share.

Districts that can not cover more than 105% of their amortization costs receive an additional 5% to the State share for Local Priority needs.
