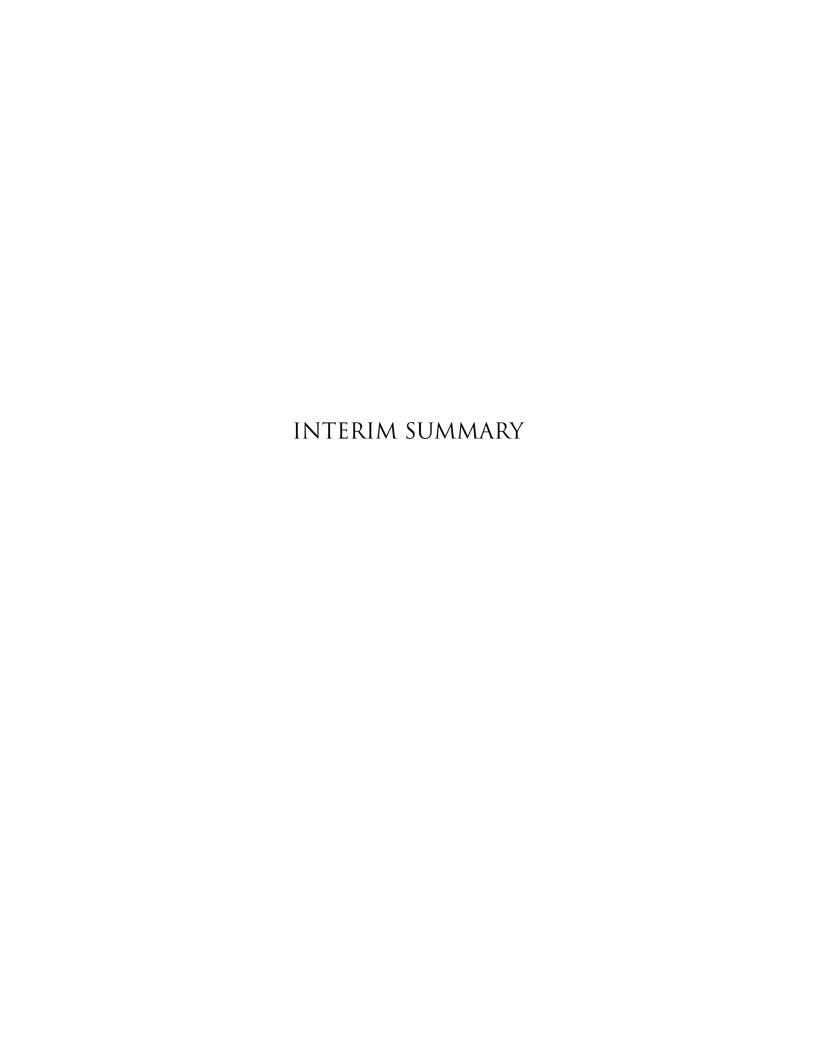

Public School Capital Outlay Oversight Task Force 2021 Interim Summary

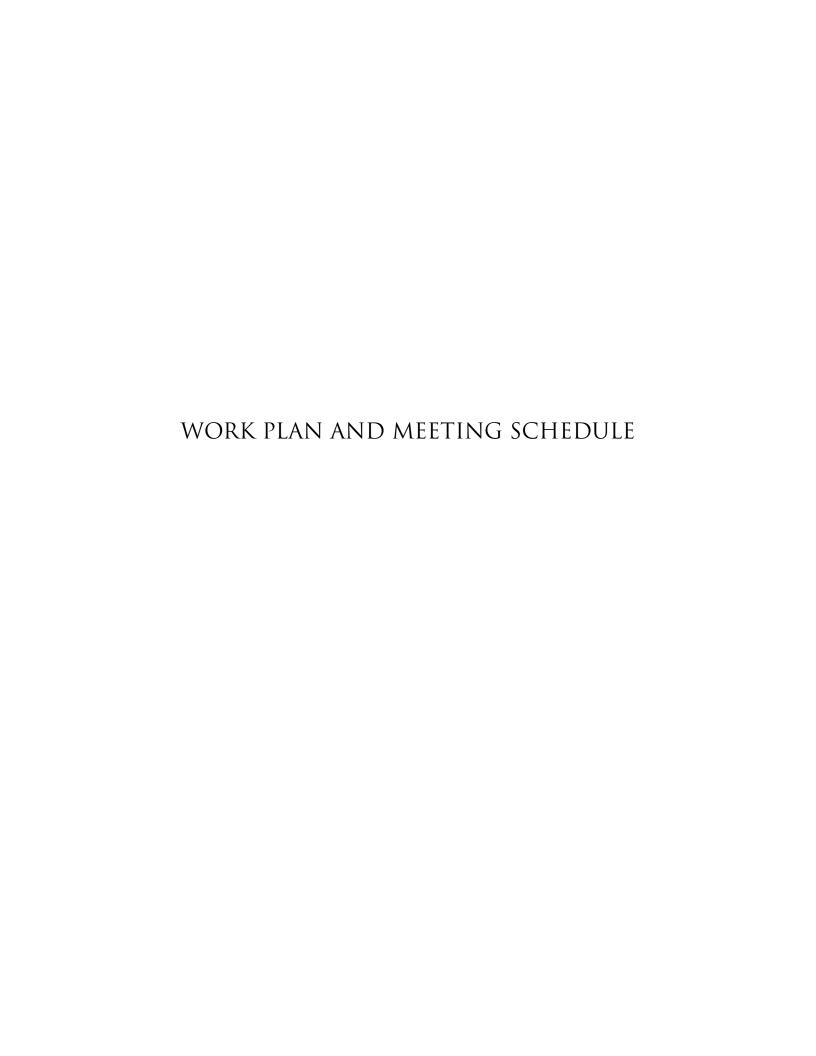
State statute allows the Public School Capital Outlay Oversight Task Force (PSCOOTF) to hold a maximum of four meetings during each interim, in addition to one organizational meeting. In 2021, meetings were held at the State Capitol in Santa Fe on June 4, July 9, August 16, September 3 and October 25, with Representative G. Andrés Romero as chair and Senator William P. Soules as vice chair.

The task force began its work, as it did at each meeting, with a general update from the Public School Facilities Authority (PSFA) that provided an overview of the public school capital funding process and reviewed current awards and projects. The PSFA also reviewed the impact of legislative action over the past two years, including appropriations that impacted public school capital projects and capital funding formula changes made by House Bill (HB) 6 (2021). The Legislative Finance Committee (LFC) gave the task force an overview of federal stimulus aid actions for education.

During the August meeting, the PSFA described the impact of declining property valuations on school districts in general. The superintendents of the Bloomfield School District and the Central Consolidated School District provided their perspectives on that issue. The Office of the Attorney General and the PSFA also provided the PSCOOTF with an overview of the history and current status of the *Zuni* lawsuit, stretching back to 1998. Members of a panel of experts on the administration and applications of broadband networks discussed their relative roles in the new Statewide Education Technology Infrastructure Network.

At the September meeting, the PSCOOTF continued to examine the impact and implementation of HB 6 (2021) on the capital funding formula for schools, with an eye on that bill's mandate for the PSCOOTF to eventually provide guidance on a specific definition of "unrestricted revenue used for capital expenditures". The task force also reviewed the process and options for charter school facilities funding.

The task force ended its work for the interim hearing about the evolving needs for early childhood facilities and a discussion of how teacher housing has been and could be further implemented throughout the state. The task force was updated on the magnitude of changes in supplemental severance tax bonding capacity from the Department of Finance and Administration, some of the underlying drivers of changing severance tax bonding capacity from the LFC and the implications of those changes from the PSFA.

Background

Created by statute (Sections 22-24-7 and 22-24-8 NMSA 1978), the Public School Capital Outlay Oversight Task Force oversees the work of the Public School Capital Outlay Council (PSCOC) and the Public School Facilities Authority (PSFA) as they carry out the state's public school capital outlay program and other programs pursuant to the Public School Capital Outlay Act (PSCOA). Task force membership consists of 25 members (or their respective designees), with both legislative and public members determined by statute.

Work Plan

The task force will address the following statutory requirements during the 2021 interim:

- 1. oversee the work of the PSCOC and the PSFA as they perform functions pursuant to the PSCOA, particularly as the agencies implement the statewide process for making grant awards;
- 2. monitor the existing permanent revenue streams to ensure that they remain adequate long-term funding sources for public school capital outlay projects;

- 3. monitor the overall progress of bringing all public school facilities up to the statewide adequacy standards developed pursuant to provisions in the PSCOA; and
- 4. monitor the progress and effectiveness of programs administered pursuant to the PSCOA and the Public School Capital Improvements Act.

In addition, as time permits, the task force will:

- 5. monitor developments in the *Zuni* lawsuit and consider recommendations to meet court requirements;
- 6. consider the implementation of changes enacted by Laws 2021, Chapter 52 (House Bill 6: State Equalization Guarantee Distributions), including evaluating the implications of and providing input to the PSCOC rules for the definition of "unrestricted revenue used for capital expenditures";
- 7. review the broadband infrastructure funding for schools, including monitoring the establishment of a statewide education technology infrastructure network and other changes created by Laws 2021, Chapter 49 (Senate Bill 144: Remote Education Technology Infrastructure):
- 8. review the current capital outlay funding process and options for charter schools in New Mexico;
- 9. evaluate the proliferation of additional separate programs that the PSFA is tasked with administering in relation to the staffing resources available to the PSFA;
 - 10. review strategies for improving the funding of maintenance costs for school facilities;
 - 11. receive a report on special appropriations made for impact aid districts;
- 12. review the impact of funding for demolition allowed by Laws 2021, Chapter 27 (Senate Bill 43: Funding of Demolition of Abandoned Schools);
- 13. review developments in the needs and structure of funding for teacher housing, including how those developments have been impacted by recent legislation and new awards programs;
- 14. review the functioning of state adequacy standards, including how those standards pertain to small combined schools;
 - 15. monitor response options of schools with declining bonding capacity; and

16. receive testimony on how early childhood education programs in public schools have impacted facility space needs and how those programs in public schools are expected to impact needs in the future.

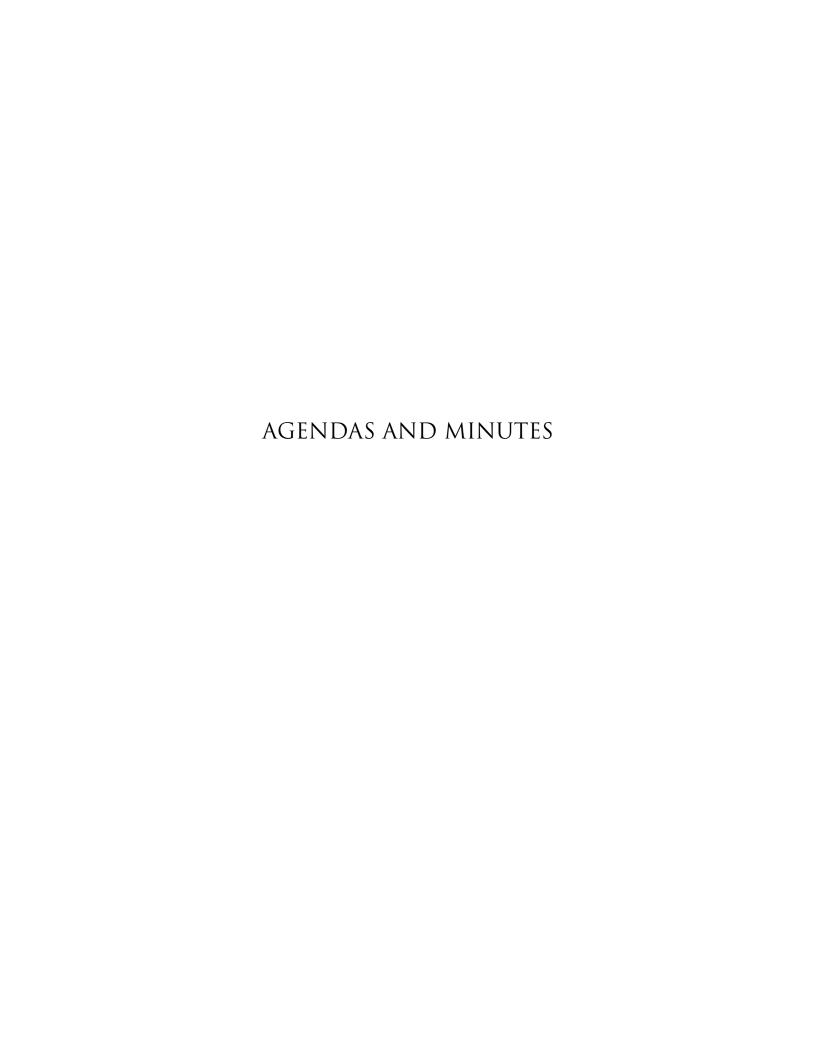

Statewide Education Technology Infrastructure Network (2:04 p.m.)

Raja Sambandam, acting secretary, Department of Information Technology (DoIT), introduced Rand Tilton, program manager, DoIT, and Gar Clarke, project manager, DoIT, who reviewed the 2021 broadband legislation, including House Bill (HB) 10, Senate Bill (SB) 93 and SB 377, as well as the three-year economic development grant. Tim Bedeaux, legislative liaison, Public Education Department (PED), introduced Mike Archibeque, president and project manager, MA Strategies, and Ferdi Serim, project data manager, MA Strategies, who gave an overview of the PED's 2021 New Mexico Student Connect program. Jeremy Lovato, chief information officer (CIO), Department of Transportation, outlined the fiber and data infrastructure operation for facility connectivity throughout New Mexico.

Eli Guinnee, state librarian, New Mexico State Library, and Richard Govea, broadband opportunities program manager, New Mexico State Library, addressed the broadband challenges and goals for libraries across the state. Jason Collet, CIO, Western New Mexico University, and president, Consortium on Higher Education Computing/Communication Services; Chris Kielt, interim CIO, New Mexico State University; and Dan Lunceford, director of information technology and communication, New Mexico Institute of Mining and Technology, gave an overview of the collaborative aspect of establishing a statewide education network. Impact and Implementation of House Bill 6 (2021) on the Capital Funding Formula for Schools (10:38 a.m.)

Mr. Chamblin and Mr. Evans reviewed the capital funding formula for New Mexico school districts and outlined the changes in Subsection K of Section 7 of House Bill 6 (2021),

which require the PSCOC to develop rules that will change the formula to include a new local revenue source. Martin Romine, director of finance, Zuni Public School District, and Jvanna L. Hanks II, deputy superintendent, Gallup-McKinley County School District, expressed the need for an ongoing collaborative subcommittee to address the complexity of issues involved, such as unrestricted revenues, global resources and teacherages. Claire Cieremans, chief finance officer, Los Lunas Public School District; Ludym Martinez, associate superintendent for finance, Gadsden Independent School District; Leslie Pearce, business manager, Tatum Municipal School District; and Tami Coleman, chief financial officer, Albuquerque Public School District, addressed the impact that the new capital funding formulas will have on their respective districts, and more specifically, how restricted and unrestricted revenues will affect state and local matching funds. Terry Dean, executive director, New Mexico Association of School Business Officials, expressed concerns about which revenues will be restricted and emphasized the importance of ensuring that the funding formula remain beneficial, in accordance with the intent of the legislation.
